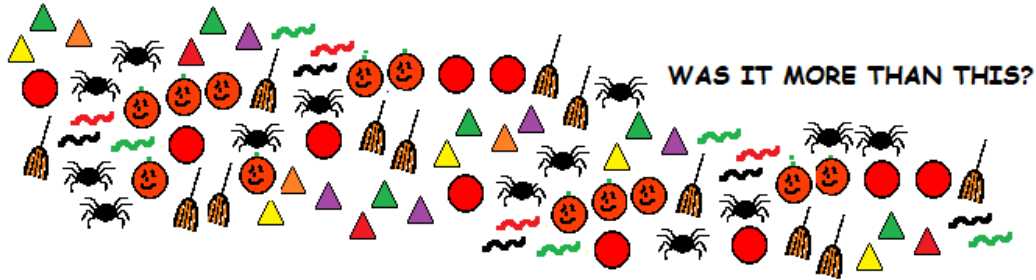


Eating Up the Candy
